Christian Aid Mission supports indigenous missionaries who are sharing the gospel in some of the world's most difficult fields. One of their partners, New Tribes Mission (NTM), is a church-planting ministry working among unreached people groups. The NTM staff trains ethnic believers to serve as pastors and elders in their home churches. They also engage in community development through agricultural projects, literacy, and healthcare programs.

To prepare indigenous missionaries for the field, NTM operates a School of Missions.

Transporting students to and from school had become a difficult challenge, especially for those students living in remote locations.

Oneway Africa Team

The ministry team of OneWay Africa (a part of OneWay Ministries) travel far and wide to bring the gospel to unreached people groups throughout the

country of Ghana. From their headquarters in Accra, they cover thousands of miles each year over the rough African terrain. When visiting very remote areas, there are often no roads available and the team must drive through the bush using motorcycle paths. Various hazards include flooding, deep potholes, and rocky surfaces, all of which are tough on vehicles.



EGYPT

The **STREAMS** OF **LIVING** WATER team in Egypt manages ministries in twenty different countries, operating out of separate workplace locations. Streams recently acquired an office building with room for all of their staff to work together, which will greatly improve efficiency and communication. They are in the process of renovating the building and need assistance to upgrade the fire alarm system to meet current building codes. Equipment includes Loop Wiring, 35 smoke detectors, and 20 break-glass fire alarms.

NIGERIA 52

RISHAMA INTERNATIONAL runs the **Faith and Hope Christian Academy** in central Nigeria where many of their 420 students are orphaned and others come from critically impoverished families. Because electric supply in Nigeria is so unpredictable and the school's back-up generators use expensive diesel fuel, MPF is funding equipment for a <u>solar power hookup</u> so that this Christian academy can transition to reliable solar power before the next school year.

BOLD HOPE is building a Community Center that will house a church and school in a transitional community for struggling Haitian immigrants. Many immigrants who come to the DR to work in sugar cane plantations live in areas called "bateyes" where conditions are horrendous. MPF is raising funds to get equipment for a well site which will serve hundreds of residents who live in the new community. Equipment needed includes a well pump, generator, cistern, and cistern pump.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

SHARE EDUCATION SERVICES supports overseas missionaries in the task of educating their children through conferences, tests, and other resources. After the pandemic, SHARE realized the positive effect virtual ministry can have. They wish to upgrade their equipment and purchase items which will allow them to stream in-person events, webinars, podcasts, and set up an online audio/visual resource library for missionaries. Equipment needs are <u>bluetooth speakers</u>, <u>projector</u>, <u>camcorder</u>, <u>channel mixer</u>, <u>and more</u>.

HOPE'S PROMISE strengthens families through Christ-centered foster care, adoption, and orphan care. They have seven "Hope Homes" in Vietnam where Christian couples care for the needs of several children. MPF is raising funds to help make these homes safer and more comfortable. SOUTH ASIA

The staff at **PAK7** make high-quality videos accessible to people in a South Asian country that has the second highest number of unreached people groups in the world. They operate a 24-hour satellite TV channel and currently have to rent expensive equipment. MPF is raising funds for them to purchase their own equipment and continue to reach the unreached with the gospel of Christ. Items needed are <u>LED Dome Lights</u>, <u>Sony and Samyang Camera & Lens Kits</u>, and a <u>Libec 650 Tripod System</u>.

SPRING FUNDRAISER

LIVE EAR MINISTRIES supports language, education, evangelization, and life empowerment for the deaf community in West Africa. Their Christian deaf school has over 50 students and 21 staff members. Because electric supply is very unreliable and expensive, they want to upgrade to solar-power to run lights, fans, computers, and more. This project will benefit not only the school and church, but the whole community! Items needed are solar panels, batteries, converters, cables, structure supports, etc.



SPRING FUNDRAISER

766 **BARBADOS**

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATING MINISTRIES (ICM) supports indigenous believers and churches by equipping them with two vital resources: a permanent church building and discipleship tools for oral learners. Their partner in Barbados needs help to train and equip local Christian leaders. MPF is raising funds for 300 Solar-powered Audio Players loaded with an audio Bible and ICM's Foundations Curriculum and 300 Kingdom Cross USB's with the same audio Bible and Foundation materials plus a copy of the Jesus Film.

SOUTH AFRICA

Pastor Dennis works alongside ABWE missionaries and runs a radio ministry called Sound Doctrine Hub through which the gospel is reaching into South Africa like never before. He needs video equipment to livestream his radio show and post it online along with local evangelistic outreaches and Sunday morning church services. This is an important step in accessing remote areas where radio transmission is absent. Equipment includes a Sony Lens Kit, Studio Sound Card, Tripod Stand, and more.

NDIA

Nearly two years ago, THUNDERZOLL, INC. opened an Education-Feeding Center located 100 miles north of Peace Children's Home and is run by their ministry partner, Pastor Enosh. Local elementary-age school children come to the center to receive food and tutoring help. They currently serve about 70 children daily. Because electric supply in the village is unpredictable, sometimes off for days at a time, MPF is raising funds for a back-up generator so the center will have a reliable source of electricity for their ministry.

The ministry of Single Moms Raising Sons (SMRS) joined with CHRISTIAN WORLD OUTREACH four years ago. Since then, they have provided encouragement, Bible study, and teaching to numerous single moms while also caring for and guiding their fatherless sons through camps and mentoring. Many of the single moms who attend these Bible studies are impoverished, lack education, and have few resources to care for their families. Please join MPF as we raise funds for three laptops for their South African office staff.

SHEPHERD'S STAFF supports and equips churches to send out their own members as missionaries. Jay and Sumter Brantley's ministry. Nkishon (the Samburu word for "life"), works in Northern Kenya and have lived among the Samburu people for over six years. They've established a church and pastor's training college, and this summer their team is opening a pre-school for the local community. Since they are so remote, MPF was asked to help with a Solar Panel Project which will give reliable electric to these ministries.

NORTHERN KENYA

On the island of Guam, TRANS WORLD RADIO has been beaming messages of hope in Christ into the continent of Asia for almost 50 years. The infrastructure of station KTWR is a growing challenge. In the past when issues arose, it took a team of 4 or 5 people up to three days to do an inspection & repair—they have ten towers, each 250 ft. high! With a drone, it takes only 15 minutes to check out the issue and see what tools they'll need. They currently have an older, recreational model drone. MPF is funding an industrial-sized drone which will get better images, longer flight times, and be able to withstand high winds. Items needed are a DJI Mavic 3 Pro Drone, Headset, and Certification test.
